6.21 FOOTPATHS AND BRIDLEWAYS

a. Diversion of bridleways on Broxhead Common

Members considered the Order which had been made by Hampshire County Council to divert parts of bridleways Nos. 4 and 46. It was noted that objections to this order should be made before 15 February 1987.4

RESOLVED

to object to the diversion of that part of bridleway No. 46 (A-C) on the accompanying plan and to the diversion of that part of bridleway No. 4 marked (F-D) on the plan, on the grounds of loss of a small length of bridleway No. 46 and in view of the fact that the original bridleway routes had been unlawfully fenced off and gates erected which had forced riders and walkers to take the proposed diverted routes and this would merely serve to sanction an unlawful act.

b. Footpaths, A Practical Handbook

Noted that this booklet, which had been purchased from the British Trust for Conservation Volunteers had now been received, at a cost of £8-55p. The booklet appeared to offer considerable advice and practical help in connection with footpath maintenance.
