Bridleways 4 and 46 Broxhead, Headley

Bridleways 4 and 46 are situated as they are today because the common was illegally fenced.

The re-instatement of the North end of FP 54 to bridleway status was lost at a public enquiry held in 1967 because of objection by the Forestry Commission.

The records of this enquiry have been destroyed both at County and in the Forestry Commission so there is no way of knowing why the Forestry Commission objected. It could be surmised that they were worried about their nursery land being ridden on; however there would be no objecting by them today so as the records are unobtainable the decision of that enquiry should not stand and another should be held for the re-instatement of FP 54 to Bridleway.

Making an illegal act legal because of the passage of time does not set a correct precedence under English law as we like to think of it. It would save time and money if these two matters were considered in the same public enquiry.
