

BRIDLEWAYS ON BROXAEAD COMECH.

Dear Sir,

The whole area of Broxhead Common is traversed by innumerable tracks, at least 23 of these may be counted on the Ordnance Map, which are used both by pedestrians and by people on horseback and have been so used for a great number of years. The Headley Parish Council recovered that this establis ed practice should be legalised by grading the main tracks as Bridleways.

On the current definitive map the rights of way are rootpaths hos. 3, 4 and 5 and it is recommended that Footpaths hos. 4 and 5 and that portion of Footpath ho. 3 from the junction with Footpath No. 4 (Point "A" in the attached shetch map) northwards to the junction with Road C. 102 be classified as Bridleways. This would constitute a single crossing of Brownead Common from South to Forth.

It is also recommended that formal authorisation be granted as a Bridleway to the track leading from the Road B. 3004 near the highest point of Brownead Common - approximately at the point marked "b" in the attached sketch map - northeastwards to the area marked "Free Piece" then coutheastwards to cross Footpath No. 4 at the p int marked "C" on the attached sketch map, and then continuing along the farm track to the junction with Footpath No. 3 at Headleywood Farm and then along Tinstead Lane to the junction with Road C. 102 at Linstead Farm. This Bridleway would then constitute a single crossing of the Common from West to East.

With the increasing volume of traffic on the public highway such Bridleways as recommended above will be an amenity increasingly appreciated by equestrians.
