I would like to draw your attention to the successful appeal made by Miss Doris Mellor, 81, to save Bachelors' Acre, New Windsor as a common for "sports and pastimes". There have since been a series of letters in the Times suggest that there is a need for legislation soon, to grant these rights of access to the public in all sensible cases, the legislation could was based on the proposals made in 1958 by the Royal Commission on Common Land, and it would be appropriate if the centenary of the Common Act 1876 was celebrated by a Commons Act 1976.

It would appear that it is now very likely that the public at large will have rights of access to Broxhead Common within the next year or two, because either Parliament will legislate to that effec or his Lordship will "infer" that rights exist.

This raises the fight to save Broxhead Common from being a narrow one to protect the rights of Commoners, to being a more gene one of the villagers of Headley fighting to save their last Common. This is as the Commoners would have always wished.
