

58. COMMONS REGISTRATION ACT, 1965

Hazeley Heath and Broxhead Common

The County Secretary has submitted a report, a copy of which appears in the Minute Book, setting out the Chairman's action in approving County Council contributions towards the costs of the hearings in respect of these two commons.

RESOLVED:

(i) Broxhead Common (C.L. 147)

To approve the Chairman's decision to pursue the appeal in collaboration with the commoners on the basis of the costs, to a figure approved by the County Secretary, being shared equally between the County Council and the Broxhead Commoners Association.

(ii) Hazeley Heath (C.L. 100)

To approve the Chairman's decision to uphold the resolution of the former County Council to contribute one third of the legal costs of the Mattingley Parish Council in substantiating their registration of Hazeley Heath as common land, on the basis of the Parish Council and the Hart District Council each paying one third.

(b) Boar Meadow (C.L. 98)

The County Secretary outlined the reasons for seeking the effective removal of certain entries in respect of this unit which had provisionally been registered as common land.

RESOLVED:

That approval be given to the appropriate action being taken to secure the effective removal from the register of certain entries relating to Boar Meadow


(c) Pond Green (C.L. 271)

The County Secretary reminded the Sub-Committee of the application to remove the land from the Register on the grounds that since the date of registration it had ceased to be Common Land. He explained the practical difficulties that the Parish Councils Registration was causing the residents. Having considered the grounds put forward by the applicant the Sub - Committee

RESOLVED:

(a) That the application to remove Pond Green from the Register of Common Land be rejected.

(b) That representations to be made to the Department of the Environment concerning the effect of registrations in situations as Pond Green.
