(c) Broxhead Common (CL. 147)

(i) Land Sub-Committee Report

The County Secretary presented for the information of members the report on Broxhead Common that went to the Land Sub-Committee and that at their meeting on 22nd June. The Land Sub-Committee had resolved "that the terms of settlement outlined in the report of the County Secretary be noted and that the completion of a lease of approximately 109 acres of Broxhead Common for 20 years at a rent of £200 per annum with upward reviews in the 5th, 10th and 15th years, together with a sub-letting at a peppercorn rent of approximately 5 acres to a cricket club or similar body, both on terms to be agreed by the County Estates Officer, be approved".


(ii) Headley Footpath No. 48 - Proposed Temporary Diversion

The County Secretary presented a report on the background to the dispute over an order made under the Town and Country Planning Act and Mineral Workings Act to temporarily divert Footpath No. 48 at Headley for a period of 7 years to allow for the extraction of gravel. After a public inquiry the Secretary of State for the Environment had declined to confirm the order. To allow the extraction of the gravel on the rest of the site the owners have now asked the County Council to make a temporary diversion order, for a period of one month, under the Hampshire County Council Act, 1972 to enable them to construct a tunnel under the footpath by means of a cut and fill tunnel operation. The local interests have been consulted all of whom were against the proposals.

RESOLVED:

That the Sub-Committee visit the site of Headley Footpath No. 48 together with representatives from the Environmental Planning Sub-Committee and other interested parties on Tuesday, 25th July, 1978.
