the Chairman informed the meeting that the
status of permanent houses in the area would
make it necessary to retain it in its present
form for some years yet.

11 Brosehead Common. Mr John Willis informed the
meeting that fencing which had been erected on
Brosehead Common by the Lord of the Manor was
a serious interference with the rights of commoners
and if nothing was done about it those rights
would disappear forever. After a lengthy
discussion, Mr Willis stated that he found it
necessary to intervene because he thought it
important to clear up a misconception which
had arisen regarding what the real problem was.
Continuing Mr Willis said there was no doubt
whatever that the land belonged to the Lord of
the Manor and if fencing had been erected it
could be that this was an interference with
the rights of any person authorised to exercise
common rights on the land. However this was
really a matter for the individuals concerned.
Concluding Mr Willis stated that beyond seeing
that the public footpaths and Bridleways were
not obstructed, the Parish Council had no
standing in the matter. Mr Willis observed that
he had a file of information on the subject and
that he would be contacting interested parties in
