

to produce the improvements which he agreed were necessary.

xi. National Assistance

The meeting noted that the Clerk had taken action as indicated and agreed that the new Rector should be acquainted with the facts as soon as he took up residence.

xii. Footpath No. 35 and Bridleways on Broxhead Common

Mr. Bingham reported on the Inquiry which took place on the 9th inst and expressed appreciation for the support tendered by Mrs. Barnard and Mr. Buck. Opposition was offered to the Council's proposals regarding Footpath No. 35 by residents on Headley Down. The Forestry Commission opposed the redesignation of a footpath on Broxhead Common to a Bridleway on the grounds that their lease of the part of the land involved, shewed a footpath only.

Mr. Bingham concluded by saying that the result of the Inquiry would not be known for some time.

xiii. Use of the Village Green for Training by Headley Football Club

The meeting noted that the Playing Fields Committee refused to consider the Council's request not to use the Green because this was a matter proper to the Parish Council. Mr. Payne stated that action should be taken to preserve and control the use of the Green. After further discussion it was decided that the appropriate Sub Committee should examine the existing Bye-laws to see what action was necessary and report back to the next meeting.
